

Qualifications criteria for phase two registrants – workers in housing support services – supervisors

The Register for Social Service Workers opened on 1 April 2003. Registration is part of the drive to raise standards and strengthen the professionalism of social services to ensure that people who use services and carers can rely on a workforce that is properly trained, appropriately qualified and effectively regulated.

The SSSC will begin registering:

- managers of housing support services from December 2010.

Other groups of workers in housing support services include:

- supervisors of housing support services
- housing support workers.

More detailed timescales for registering all groups of workers in housing support services will be announced in due course.

Qualifications criteria for phase two registrants – supervisors in housing support services

The Scottish Social Services Council consulted widely on the qualifications criteria required for workers in phase two of registration. The comments and feedback received were taken into consideration and the qualifications have been set. This information sheet sets out the qualifications required by housing support workers in housing support services. Qualification requirements will be contained in the Registration Rules which are subject to Scottish Ministers' consent.

Workers in housing support services are employed in the provision of a housing support service as defined by section 2(27) of the Regulation of Care (Scotland) Act 2001. Workers deliver general advice, assistance, counselling and support to enable clients and tenants to move into and/or remain in their homes.

It is recognised that it will take time for workers to achieve required qualifications and that employers will have to phase access to registration in order to allow sufficient time for workers to achieve required qualifications.

Applicants for registration who do not hold required qualifications may, if they meet all of the other eligibility criteria for registration eg evidence of 'good character', be granted registration subject to the condition that they achieve the required qualifications within a specified period – normally their first three year period of registration.

These are the Requirements for qualifications referred to in the SSSC's registration rules.

The SSSC will work with employers to phase in access to registration.

Principles

There is a set of general principles governing the qualifications required.

- Integration of practice and learning.
- Recognition within the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF).
- Importance of underpinning knowledge and a value base that is consistent with the Code of Practice for Social Service Workers.

Qualifications for supervisors in housing support services

Supervisors are defined as housing support workers who have responsibility for the supervision of other workers. Workers in the 'supervisors' category must hold one of the following:

- S/NVQ level 3 Housing, CIH Joint Award

Plus

- S/NVQ level 3 Principles of Care Unit – HSC35

or one of the following qualifications:

- S/NVQ level 3 in Promoting Independence
- S/NVQ level 3 in Care
- S/NVQ level 3 in Health and Social Care
- SVQ level 3 in Community Justice (Work with Offending Behaviour) or Community Justice (Work with Victims, Survivors and Witnesses)
- NVQ level 3 in Community Justice (Work with Offending Behaviour) or Community Justice (Work with Victims, Survivors and Witnesses) to include or with the addition of a value base unit ('O' unit or Principles of Care)
- Higher Education Certificate in Care (Queen Margaret University College)
- Higher Education Certificate in Person Centred Approaches for Social Care Workers (Queen Margaret University College)
- HNC Social Care (2005 revised award G7ME15)
- HNC Social Care (all other awards pre 2005) with the SVQ Health and Social Care units DK4R04;DK4K04;DK5704
- S/NVQ level 3 in Care with HNC Social Care (Combined Award)
- BA (Hons) Learning Disability Studies (University of Manchester)
- Diploma in the Training and Further Education of Mentally Handicapped Adults
- Diploma in Domiciliary Care Management
- Certificate in Deafblind Studies with the Diploma in Deafblind Studies and the Practice Unit in Deafblind Studies

plus

An additional supervisory or management qualification containing supervision or management theory and practice suitable for a supervisor of a care service with a minimum of 15 credits at SCQF level 7 or above.

or one of the following qualifications:

- S/NVQ level 4 in Care
- S/NVQ level 4 in Health and Social Care
- SVQ level 4 in Community Justice (Work with Offending Behaviour) or Community Justice (Work with Victims, Survivors and Witnesses)
- NVQ level 4 in Community Justice (Work with Offending Behaviour) or Community Justice (Work with Victims, Survivors and Witnesses) to include or with the addition of a value base unit ('O' unit or Principles of Care)
- Any qualifications as defined in the category "manager practice qualification"
- A qualification meeting the corporate membership requirements of the Chartered Institute of Housing (CIH)
- Degree or Diploma in Community Education or equivalent, as recognised by the Standards Council for Community Learning and Development for Scotland Approvals Committee
- Diploma in Social Work or equivalent qualification
- A qualification meeting the registration requirements of the General Teaching Council, Nursing and Midwifery Council, General Medical Council, the following professional groups regulated by the Health Professions Council:
 - Occupational Therapists
 - Arts, Music and Drama Therapists
 - Physiotherapists
 - Speech and Language Therapists
- A qualification meeting the requirements for chartered registration with the British Psychological Society in the divisions listed in appendix 1
- Degree or Diploma in Curative Education.

Appendix 1

Chartered Registration with the British Psychological Society

A qualification meeting the requirements for Chartered Registration with the British Psychological Society in any of the following divisions:

- Chartered Clinical Psychology
- Chartered Counselling Psychology
- Chartered Forensic Psychology
- Chartered Educational Psychology (including full membership of either the division of Educational and Child Psychology for England, Northern Ireland and Wales or the Scottish Division of Educational Psychology for Scotland)
- Chartered Health Psychologist
- Chartered Occupational Psychologist or
- Neuro-psychologists and Sports and Exercise Psychologists who have attained chartered status with the British Psychological Society.

The Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF)

The table below shows the respective levels of the different types of Scottish qualifications from school to university.

- i. The new Skills for Work courses are National Courses available as Access, Intermediate and Higher Qualifications (SCQF levels 3 – 6).
- ii. Ongoing work to credit rate SVQs shows that SVQ units range from SCQF level 4 to level 12. SVQs at 3 and 4 can be placed at different SCQF levels.
