


Monica's story

My name is Monica. I'm a social care worker employed by Care Concern, and I love my job, but as a refugee my journey to the happy place I am now has been very hard.

I was born in Eritrea, which is one of the poorest countries in the world and has a poor record on human rights. When I was about 13 or 14, I worked in Sudan, looking



I came to Scotland on my own, I have no family here, but I do have 2 younger brothers and a sister who are in Ethiopia and some day I hope they can join me.

When I was granted refugee status, I found out about the <u>Scottish Refugee Council</u> (SRC). They helped me so much to integrate into society, from advice on housing and employment to basic things like using public "After I got this job, I am more confident, very happy every day and interested in working extra shifts because I like the job... transport. I wanted to do something with my life so I applied to study ESOL, followed by <u>ESOL</u> <u>Transitions – Social Care</u>.

I looked for a job in social care but there were many challenges and disappointments. Some of the jobs were just too far to travel and others I just didn't pass the interview, but I couldn't understand why and was very depressed.

The SRC arranged for me to attend an information session with a care provider and then I had an interview with Care Concern. The application process was straightforward, and the care home was close to where I was living, I was so happy when they offered me a job.

I've been a care worker for over 9 months now and I am very happy. Caring for people is so good as I feel that I am looking after my mum, and we may all need someone to help look after us one day. I like talking to the people and hear their life stories, it also helps me improve my English.

I feel like a real human now, much more confident and I feel good and not depressed. Every day is exciting as I now have money to pay my bills, save some and help my family. I am now proud of myself for what I have accomplished and the independence I have achieved.
