Amount	Support from £500, maximum £5,000.
Purpose	For development of new processes, services or to carry out research. Funding from the Scottish Funding Council (SFC), to build relation- ships between Small to Medium Enterprises (SMEs), up to 250 employees, and Higher Education Institutes (HEIs) to encourage innovation through collaboration. The SFC make an award to the HEI, the SME contribution should match the grant either in cash or an in kind contribution such as staff, time or access to facilities.
